Experience a New Take on *Rhapsody in Blue* with Virtuoso Pius Cheung and his Magic Marimba Asian Première of Bright Sheng's *Colours of Crimson* under the Baton of Singaporean Conductor Joshua Tan

Chinese-Canadian Pius Cheung is recognized as one of the world's most gifted young marimba artists, famed for both his wonderfully colourful performances and his adaptations of standard classical repertory. On 23&24 March Cheung will perform his own adaptation of Gershwin's famous Rhapsody in Blue for marimba and orchestra. He will also give the Asian première of Bright Sheng's Colours of Crimson – Fantasy for Marimba and Orchestra, both works under the baton of Singaporean conductor Joshua Tan. Also on the programme are works by Bartók and Milhaud.

After winning First Prize in the 2008 Young Concert Artists International Auditions, Chinese-Canadian marimbist Pius Cheung made débuts at Carnegie's Zankel Hall in New York, the Kennedy Centre in Washington, and at the Isabella Stewart Gardner Museum in Boston. Recent engagements have included a concerto performance of Creston's Marimba Concerto with the Simon Sinfonietta (MA), appearances with Stratford Summer Music in Ontario and the Edmonton Symphony Orchestra under the direction of conductor Alondra de la Parra in Alberta, and recitals at the Cosmos Club in Washington, the Oberlin College Conservatory, the International Marimba Conference and Festival in Minnesota, and his Japanese recital début at the Japan National Percussion Association Festival, where he served as guest artist and competition judge.

Born in Hong Kong, he moved to Vancouver with his family at the age of 12 and received his Bachelor of Music from the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia, his Artist Diploma from The Boston Conservatory and his Doctorate from the University of Michigan.

Joshua Tan, conductor

Currently the Assistant Conductor of the National Centre for the Performing Arts Orchestra in Beijing, Singaporean Joshua Tan was 2nd Prize winner at the 2008 Dimitri Mitropoulos International Competition and has won numerous other awards and scholarships, including the Bruno Walter Memorial Foundation Award. He is the first ever recipient of the Charles Schiff Conducting Prize from the Juilliard School for outstanding achievement.

In 2006 he was conducting fellow under Charles Dutoit with the Guangzhou Symphony Orchestra and in 2008 he was awarded a fellowship to the American Academy of Conducting at Aspen under David Zinman. Recent engagements have included débuts with the Beethoven Orchestra Bonn, Macao Symphony Orchestra, Taipei Symphony Orchestra, National Taiwan Symphony Orchestra and the Musical Olympus International Festival in St Petersburg.

Programme

Rhapsody in Blue crowns this programme, but in an entirely new guise. The ultimate statement in symphonic jazz will be performed by Pius Cheung in his own adaptation for marimba and orchestra. Paired with it is Darius Milhaud's scintillating and toe-tapping French/Brazilian romp, *The Ox on the Roof.*

Bright Sheng's *Colours of Crimson* is a blending of the marimba's unique sound with the orchestral palette. Using a love song which he wrote while living in Qinghai, Bright Sheng creates a sound world where marimba and orchestra enrich each other. Bridging these two works is Bartók's Dance Suite, featuring lively Hungarian folk dance rhythms.
