Sing Handel & Mozart Sing! Charismatic Bass-baritone Andrew Foster-Williams Sings Arias by Two Master Composers (22 & 23 June)

Acclaimed by *The Independent* as "no praise is too high for **Andrew Foster-Williams**", the charismatic bass-baritone will revisit the **Hong Kong Philharmonic** audience with his specialty repertoire of arias by Mozart and Handel from their Italian operas such as *Le Nozze di Figaro* and *Rinaldo*. **Mozart +:** "Sing Handel & Mozart Sing" will be held in the **Hong Kong City Hall Concert Hall** on **22 and 23**June (Fri and Sat), 8pm.

The Orchestra and Foster-Williams will be conducted by English baroque specialist **Nicholas McGegan**. The rest of the Baroque and Classical programme includes Rameau's *Naïs* Suite and Mozart's *Linz* Symphony.

Andrew Foster-Williams, bass-baritone

Acclaimed throughout the press for his authoritative, sonorous and regal voice, Andrew Foster-Williams has established himself as an exciting, young talent in the Classical Music world. Combining intelligent music-making with an instinctual dramatic sense, Andrew brings vocal virtuosity and charisma to



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concert hall and opera house alike.

A busy concert vocalist, Foster-Williams has sung Haydn *Die Jahreszeiten* with the London Symphony Orchestra and Sir Colin Davis (also to be recorded for LSO Live), with Schleswig-Holstein Musik Festival and The Gulbenkian Orchestra Lisbon with Paul McCreesh; *Messiah* for the New York Philharmonic with Bernard Labadie; Bach Lutheran Mass with The Cleveland Orchestra and Franz Welser-Möst; Mozart Requiem with the Philadelphia Orchestra and Yannick Nézet-Séguin; and Don Fernando in *Fidelio* for the Hong Kong Philharmonic and Edo de Waart.

Operatically, Andrew sings Leporello in *Don Giovanni* and Albert in Massenet's *Werther* for Washington National Opera; his first Four Villains in Offenbach *Les Contes D'Hoffman* in Moscow and his first Don Pizarro in *Fidelio* for Opera North; and Nick Shadow in The Rake's Progress for Opera National de Lorraine. Recent opera appearances have included singing Sleep, Winter, Corydon and Hymen in Purcell's The Fairy Queen at the 2009 Glyndebourne Festival with William Christie and Cold Genius, Aeolus and Comus in a new Mark Morris production of Purcell's King Arthur for English National Opera and in San Francisco.

Nicholas McGegan, conductor

Nicholas McGegan is loved by audiences and orchestras for performances that match authority with enthusiasm, scholarship with joy, and curatorial responsibility with evangelical exuberance. The London *Independent* calls him "one of the finest baroque conductors of his generation" and The New Yorker lauds him as "an expert in 18th-century style."

McGegan has been a remarkably durable presence in the world of baroque music through long-term appointments with San Francisco's Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra (which was named Musical America's 2004 Ensemble of the Year), Germany's International Handel-Festival Göttingen, Sweden's Drottningholm Theatre, The Milwaukee Symphony and the Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra. His





discography of over 100 releases includes the world premiere recording of Handel's *Susanna*, which attracted both a Gramophone Award and Grammy nomination

He's one of the few baroque specialists to regularly conduct the world's major orchestras, including those of Atlanta, Boston, Chicago, Cleveland, Detroit, Houston, Los Angeles, Montreal, New York, Philadelphia, San Francisco, St. Louis, Washington, the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra, Göteborg Symphony Orchestra, and Amsterdam's Royal Concertgebouw Orchestra.

In 2010 Mr. McGegan was made an OBE, an Officer of the Order of the British Empire, "for service to music overseas."

Forget the stories about a jealous rival poisoning him. Mozart was admired by his contemporaries and continues to be so by musicians and music lovers to this day. His genius is revealed here in a symphony which, despite being written in record time, bears the true stamp of greatness and two fantastic arias for the operatic stage, which Mozart regarded as his ideal musical home.

And what of Mozart's own musical heroes? Handel was his favourite, so what could be more appropriate than to hear some of Handel's own great operatic arias for the bass voice.

"No praise is too high for Andrew Foster-Williams", wrote *The Independent* of our soloist who has made something of a speciality in singing the bass roles from Mozart and Handel, while fellow-Englishman Nicholas McGegan is admired around the world as one of today's great interpreters of Baroque and Classical music.
