Turkish Pianist Extraordinaire Hüseyin Sermet Closes HKPO 2011/12 Season With Ravel's Two Piano Concertos (6 & 7 July)

In December 2010, Turkish pianist extraordinaire <u>Hüseyin Sermet</u> rounded off Istanbul's year as European City of Culture. This year he brings his unique blend of the exotic and the exciting to the **Hong Kong Philharmonic Orchestra (HKPO)** stage to round off our concert season in a Finale which includes Ravel's Piano Concertos in G and for the Left Hand. Conducted by <u>Lawrence Foster</u>, the **Swire Maestro:** "Enigmas" concerts will be held at 8pm, 6 & 7 July 2012 (Fri & Sat) in Hong Kong Cultural Centre Concert Hall. Rest of the Finale programme will include Brahms' Variations on a Theme by Joseph Haydn and Elgar's Variations on an Original Theme *Enigma*.

Audience will have a chance to find out more from conductor Foster in a **Post-Concert Chat** on **6 July**. Audiences with tickets (either Fri or Sat) are welcome to stay and join. Pianist, composer, and pedagogue, Turkish-born Hüseyin Sermet is an artist at the peak of his powers; his extensive repertoire, refined over the course of a distinguished thirty-year career, reflects his wide ranging musical interests and pianistic versatility.

He has performed and recorded with some of the world's finest musicians, including Lorin Maazel, Mstislav Rostropovich, Semyon Bychkov, Antal Dorati, Jonathan Nott and David Robertson; and has worked with orchestras such as the Symphonieorchester des Bayerischen Rundfunks, Orchestre de Paris, Bamberger Symphoniker, Tokyo Symphony Orchestra, NHK Symphony, Shanghai Symphony, Detroit Symphony and Royal Philharmonic orchestras.

In December 2010, Sermet participated in the closing classical music event of the 2010 Istanbul European Capital of Culture with the London Philharmonic Orchestra under Vladimir Jurowski at the Is Sanat Concert Hall in Istanbul. He has been bestowed the title of State Artist by the Turkish Government.

Lawrence Foster holds the positions of Music Director of Orchestre et Opéra National de Montpellier and Artistic Director and Chief Conductor of the Gulbenkian Orchestra. He brought the Gulbenkian Orchestra to the Kissinger Sommer Festival for two concerts in June 2010, and will also take them to the Enescu Festival in Bucharest in September 2011. They have made a number of recordings for PentaTone Classics which include Salieri's Requiem combined with Beethoven's *Meerestille und gluckliche Fahrt* and a CD of Hungarian music featuring works by Bartók, Kodály and Ligeti.

Orchestral highlights of Maestro Foster include appearances with NDR Sinfonieorchester Hamburg, NDR Radiophilharmonie Hannover, Gewandhausorchester (with Lisa Batiashvili as soloist), Helsinki





Philharmonic Orchestra, and Netherlands Philharmonic Orchestra. He also conducted both Chopin Piano Concertos with Daniel Barenboim as soloist with both the Gulbenkian Orchestra and Orchestre Philharmonique de Monte Carlo. He has a long-standing relationship with Radu Lupu; they performed all of Beethoven's Piano Concertos together with Orchestre National de Lyon last season, and this season they will collaborate with Orchestre de Chambre de Lausanne.

Born in 1941 in Los Angeles to Romanian parents, Lawrence Foster has been a major champion of the music of Georg Enescu, serving as Artistic Director of the Georg Enescu Festival from 1998 to 2001. In January 2003 he was decorated by the Romanian President for services to Romanian Music.

Programme

Brahms thought his delightful set of variations for orchestra was based on a tune by Haydn, while Elgar refused to tell anyone who wrote the theme that inspired his famous work – hence the *Enigma* of the title. For his part, Ravel wrote two piano concertos but only one where the pianist uses both hands.

Puzzled? Popular American English conductor Lawrence Foster has all the answers at the tip of his baton.
